## Who Are the Friends?

The Estes Park Museum was founded in 1962 when a group of citizens saved artifacts from Steads Ranch in Rocky Mountain National Park before the building's demolition.

The building on 200 Fourth Street was first constructed with volunteer labor. Since 2002, the Museum has operated as a Town department and the original group of dedicated volunteers established non-profit status and are the Estes Park Museum Friends & Foundation, Inc., or "Friends."

The Historic Fall River Hydroplant at 1754 Fish Hatchery Road was built by F. O. Stanley in 1909. It now serves as an interpretive center run by the Museum and open to the public during the summer.

The Friends support the Museum by operating the Museum Shop, publishing books through the Friends Press, fundraising, capital improvements, and encouraging community involvement.
